what kind & nature soever both of the house & kitchen also all
the property belonging to me John Witherspoon Sr. I will
bequeath to my son James Witherspoon, one dollar, to be
paid to him James Witherspoon, in twelve months after
my decease, I give & bequeath to my son Moses Withers-
poon, one dollar, to be paid in twelve months after my
decease, I will & bequeath to my son Mrs Patterson Witherspoon,
one dollar, to be paid in twelve months after my decease,
I will & bequeath to my son John Martin Witherspoon, one
dollar, to be paid in twelve months after my decease,
I will & bequeath to my son Jackson Dawson Witherspoon,
one dollar, to be paid in twelve months after my decease,
I will & bequeath to my son Robert Witherspoon, one doll

twelve months after my decease, to Margot Hamblin,
I will and bequeath one dollar, to be paid in twelve
months after my decease, to Elizabeth Woods, I will &
bequeath one dollar, to her to be paid in twelve months
after my decease, I will & bequeath to Easter Woods, one
dollar, to be paid in twelve months after my decease,
I will & bequeath to Polly Galaspy Sampson, one dollar,
to be paid in twelve months after my decease, I hereby
appoint my son Samuel Witherspoon, sole executor of
my last will & testament - In witness whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and seal this 27 of December
1842. NB. It is my will that no advantage be taken
of this my last will & testament owing to any imper-
fections that may be in the above will - Hencein
my hand & seal as above
